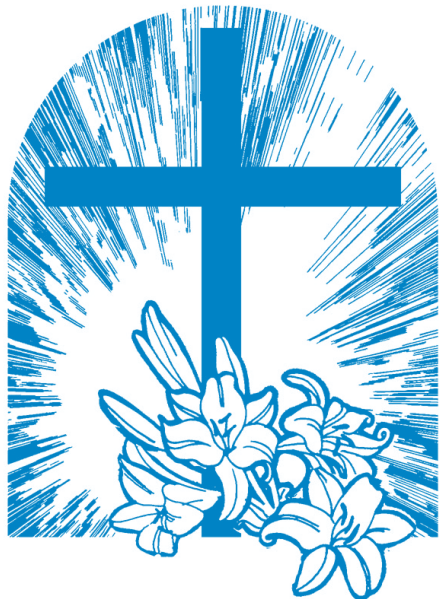

PASTOR'S CORNER

The Seven Disciplines of Discipleship: 1. Prayer of the Heart, 2. Word of God, 3. Eucharist, 4. Confession, 5. Faith-sharing Community, 6. Merciful Service, 7. Evangelization. On this great Feast of Easter we focus on the discipline of **EVANGELIZATION**. On the day of his resurrection, Jesus returned to the world that rejected him and to the disciples that deserted him, with the words, "Peace be with you. ... Receive the Holy Spirit! ... As the Father has sent me, so I am sending you." (John 20:21-22) On the day of his Ascension, Jesus said, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and know that I am with you always, to the close of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20) Evangelization in its essence means believing, living and sharing with others the treasure of Jesus' victory over sin, over death, and over the devil. Through the Mysteries of Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Confession, Anointing of the Sick, Matrimony, and Holy Orders; through the Disciplines of Prayer of the Heart, hearing and obeying the Word of God, Faith-sharing Community, Charisms of Merciful Service, and living the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity and obedience, we come to know "Christ in us," and thus are empowered to EVANGELIZE. (see Colossians 1:27) The Church exists to evangelize. All the Sacraments and the Disciplines of Discipleship find their purpose and their fulfillment in the mission of evangelization. "To make disciples" means to evangelize persons. In the mission of evangelization, the Holy Spirit does the heavy lifting. The Holy Spirit breaks through the barriers of sin and re-animates ailing hearts. But by God's plan, grace builds on nature; the Holy Spirit abides in and works through our "earthen vessels." God's power is perfected in our weaknesses, yielded to him as we make every effort to be his witnesses. (see 2 Cor. 4:7 ff; 12:5-10) "Saint John Paul II stated in his 1990 encyclical on evangelization, *Mission of the Redeemer*, 'I sense that the moment has come to commit all of the Church's energies to a new evangelization and to the mission ad gentes. No believer in Christ, no institution of the Church can avoid this supreme duty: to proclaim Christ to all peoples.' (RM,3) The message here is that the call to evangelization is addressed to each Christian and can't be delegated to 'specialists' or committees. Nor is it adequate to occasionally have special evangelization events, as useful as they may be. What is being called for and what is necessary is that evangelization becomes part of the baptized Catholic's fundamental identity and part of our everyday way of life. It is clear that for many who bear the name of Catholic a more 'genuine contact with Christ' is needed for such a call to evangelization to even begin to make sense. Blessed Paul VI makes it clear that evangelization needs to begin with the Church itself." (from *The New Evangelization - Why Bother?* by Ralph Martin) Each and all of the Seven Disciplines of Discipleship are meant to be practical responses to the Spirit of God for bringing every disciple into genuine communion with God our Father, into friendship with our crucified and risen Lord, Jesus Christ, into union with Jesus' bride, the Church, and into the passionate mission to share this GOOD NEWS with everyone. Let's do the disciplines. Evangelization will follow as sure as the day follows the night.

RINCÓN DEL PÁRROCO

LAS SIETE DISCIPLINAS DE LOS DISCIPULOS. 1. Oración del corazón, 2. La Palabra de Dios, 3. La Eucaristía, 4. Confesión, 5. Comunidad de Fe-Compartida, 6. Servicio Misericordioso, y 7. Evangelización. En este gran Banquete de la Pascua nos concentramos en la disciplina de **EVANGELIZACIÓN**. En el día de su resurrección, Jesús regresó al mundo que lo rechazó y a los discípulos que lo abandonaron, con las palabras: “La Paz sea contigo. . . ¡Reciban el Espíritu Santo!...Ya que el Padre me ha enviado, así yo los envío.”(Juan 20:21-22) En el día de su Ascensión, Jesús dijo. “Vayan y hagan discípulos a todos los pueblos y bautícenlos para consagrarlos al Padre, al Hijo y al Espíritu Santo, enseñándoles a poner por obra todo lo que yo les he mandado. Y sepan que yo estoy con ustedes todos los días hasta el final de los tiempos.” (Mateo 28:18-20) Evangelización en su esencia significa creer, vivir y compartir con los demás el Tesoro de la Victoria de Jesús sobre el pecado, la muerte y el diablo. A través de los Misterios del Bautismo, Confirmación, Eucaristía, Confesión, Unción de los Enfermos, Matrimonio y Órdenes Sagradas, a través de las Disciplinas de Oración del Corazón, escuchando y obedeciendo La Palabra de Dios, la Comunidad de Fe-Compartida, Carismas de Servicio Misericordioso, y viviendo los consejos evangélicos de pobreza, castidad y obediencia, así es como conocemos a “Cristo en nosotros,” y por lo tanto facultados para EVANGELIZAR. (ver Colosenses 1:27) La Iglesia existe para evangelizar. Todos los Sacramentos y las Disciplinas de los Discípulos encuentran su propósito y cumplimiento en la misión de evangelización. “Hacer discípulos” significa que hay que evangelizar a personas. En la misión de evangelización, el Espíritu Santo hace el trabajo pesado. El Espíritu Santo rompe las barreras del pecado y re-anima corazones enfermos. Pero conforme al plan de Dios, la gracia se basa en la naturaleza; el Espíritu Santo mora y trabaja a través de nuestros “vasos de barro.” El poder de Dios se perfecciona en nuestras debilidades, cedidas a él ya que hacemos todo lo posible para ser sus testigos.(ver 2 Cor. 4:7 Ff; 12:5-10) “San Juan Pablo II declaró en su encíclica de 1990 acerca de la evangelización, *Misión del Redentor*. ‘Siento que ha llegado el momento para dedicar todas las energías eclesiales a una nueva evangelización y a la misión de ad gentes. Ningún creyente en Cristo, ninguna institución de la Iglesia puede evitar este deber supremo de proclamar a Cristo a todos los pueblos.’ (RM, 3) El mensaje aquí es que el llamado a evangelizar se dirige a cada uno de los cristianos y no se puede delegar a “especialistas” o comités. Tampoco es adecuado tener ocasionalmente eventos especiales de evangelización, aunque puedan ser útiles. Lo que se pide y lo que se necesita es que la evangelización se convierta en parte de la identidad fundamental de los Católicos bautizados y parte de nuestra forma de vida cotidiana. Esta claro que para muchos que llevan el nombre de Católicos necesitan un ‘contacto más genuino con Cristo’ para que el llamado a la evangelización tenga sentido. El Santo Pablo VI pone en claro que la evangelización debe comenzar con la propia Iglesia.” (de la Nueva Evangelización - ¿Por qué molestarse? de Ralph Martin) Todas y cada una de las siete Disciplinas de los Discípulos son respuestas prácticas al Espíritu de Dios para traer a cada discípulo en una comunión genuina con el Padre, en amistad con nuestro Señor crucificado y resucitado, Jesucristo, en unión con la novia Jesús, a Iglesia y con la apasionante misión de compartir estas BUENAS NOTICIAS con todos. Hagamos las disciplinas. La Evangelización seguirá tan seguro como el día sigue a la noche.
