PASTOR'S CORNER

Love Is Our Mission: The Family Fully Alive. *"We will reflect in particular on the family, which is the fundamental cell of society. From the beginning the Creator blessed man and woman so that they might be fruitful and multiply, and so the family then is an image of the Triune God in the world. (...) We are called to acknowledge how beautiful, true and good it is to start a family, to be a family today; and how indispensable the family is for the life of the world and for the future of humanity. We are called to make known God's magnificent plan for the family and to help spouses joyfully experience this plan in their lives as we accompany them amidst so many difficulties" (Pope Francis, p.13). "Our God is not inaccessible and remote; we believe that God reveals himself in Jesus Christ. Jesus is the source of the faith, hope, love and joy that should animate Catholic family life. He is the reason we can trust the wisdom of Catholic belief. Everything we offer in this catechesis flows from Jesus himself." (...) "But we live in a time of deep worldly skepticism about any 'bigger plan' or higher meaning to human experience. For many people the human person is little more than an accident of evolution; carbon atoms with an attitude. In other words, for many people we have no higher purpose than whatever meaning we create for ourselves." (p.15). (...) "Amid this uncertainty, Christians are people who trust in Jesus Christ. (...) As Saint John Paul II proclaimed in his first encyclical: "in man's history, [the] revelation of love and mercy has taken a form and a name: that of Jesus Christ." (p.16). "As Pope Francis explained in his first encyclical: "To those who suffer, God does not provide arguments which explain everything; rather his response is that of an accompanying presence, a history of goodness which touches every story of suffering and opens up a ray of light. In Christ, God himself wishes to share this path with us and to offer us his gaze so that we might see the light within it. Christ is the one who, having endured suffering, is the "pioneer and perfecter of our faith." (p. 17). **Love Is Our Mission** is available in the St. Marelllo Book Store. More to come.*

RINCÓN DEL PÁRROCO

El Amor Es Nuestra Misión – La Familia Plenamente Viva,

“En estos días reflexionaremos de modo particular sobre la familia, que es la célula básica de la sociedad humana. El Creador ha bendecido desde el principio al hombre y a la mujer para que fueran fecundos y se multiplicaran sobre la tierra; así, la familia representa en el mundo como un reflejo de Dios, Uno y Trino. (...) Lo que se nos pide es reconocer lo bello, auténtico y bueno que es formar una familia, ser familia hoy; lo indispensable que es esto para la vida del mundo, para el futuro de la humanidad. Se nos pide que realcemos el plan luminoso de Dios sobre la familia, y ayudemos a los cónyuges a vivirlo con alegría en su vida, acompañándolo en sus muchas dificultades” (Papa Francisco, p.13). “Nuestro Dios no es inaccesible ni distante, creemos que Dios se revela a sí mismo en Jesucristo. Jesús es la fuente de esperanza, fe, amor y gozo que deben animar la vida de la familia Católica. Él es la razón por la que podemos confiar en la sabiduría de la creencia católica. Todo lo que ofrecemos en esta catequesis brota de Jesús mismo.” (...) “Pero vivimos en una época de un profundo escepticismo mundano acerca de cualquier “plan que sobrepasa” o de cualquier significado transcendental a la experiencia humana. Para muchas personas, la persona humana es poco más que un accidente evolutivo; átomos de carbono con actitud. En otras palabras, para muchas personas, no tenemos propósito más alto que cualquier significado que creemos para nosotros mismos.” (p.15). (...) “En medio de esta incertidumbre, los cristianos son personas que confían en Jesucristo. (...) Como lo proclamó San Juan Pablo II en su primera encíclica:” y tal revelación del amor y de la misericordia tiene en la historia del hombre una forma y un nombre: se llama Jesucristo”. (p.16). “Como el Papa Francisco lo explicó en su primera encíclica: “Al hombre que sufre Dios no le da razonamiento que explique todo; sino que le responde con una presencia que le acompaña, con una historia de bien que se une a toda historia de sufrimiento para abrir en ella un resquicio de luz. En Cristo, Dios mismo ha querido compartir con nosotros este camino y ofrecernos su mirada para darnos luz. Cristo es aquel que, habiendo soportado el dolor, “inició y completa nuestra fe.” (p.17).
