PASTOR'S CORNER

THE MEANING OF THE MASS: The Old Testament Reading. The Old Testament includes 46 books written over a span of 1000 years. The general categories of these books are Law, History, Prophets, Wisdom and Psalms. The central event of the Old Testament is the Passover when God brought Israel out of slavery in Egypt and into the land promised to Abraham and his descendants. With the coming of Jesus as Lord and Messiah, and through the Paschal Mystery of his Incarnation, Life, Passion, Death, Resurrection, Ascension and sending of the Spirit, salvation history has reached its ultimate CENTER. Now the Old Testament books point ahead and shed light on Jesus who is the SOURCE, SUMMIT and CENTER of human history! On the day of his Resurrection, when Jesus accompanied the two forlorn disciples on the road to Emmaus, he told them, "How slow you are to believe all that the prophets have announced! ...Beginning then with Moses and all the prophets, Jesus interpreted for them every passage of scripture which referred to him" (Lk. 24:27). In another appearance Jesus said, "Everything written about me in the law of Moses and the prophets and psalms had to be fulfilled. ... Thus it is written that the Messiah must suffer and rise from the dead on the third day" (Lk. 24:44-46). Thus the Church uses the inspired scriptures from the Old Testament in her Divine Liturgy so that the Holy Spirit can enlighten our minds and enflame our hearts, bringing us into a deeper communion with Jesus, the Way, the Truth and the Life, and through Jesus with our heavenly Father and with one another!

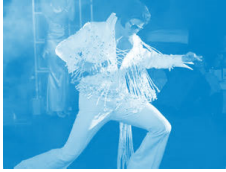

EL SIGNIFICADO DE LA MISA: Lectura del Antiguo Testamento. El antiguo testamento contiene 46 libros escritos durante un período de 1000 años. Las categorías generales de estos libros son Ley, Historia, Profetas, Sabiduría y Salmos. El acto central del Antiguo Testamento es la Pascua cuando Dios sacó a Israel de la esclavitud en Egipto y en la tierra prometida a Abraham y sus descendientes. Con la venida de Jesus como Señor y Mesías, y por medio del Misterio Pascual de su Encarnación, Vida, Pasión, Muerte, Resurrección, Ascensión y envío del Espíritu, la historia de la salvación ha llegado a su CENTRO final. Ahora los libros del Antiguo Testamento apuntan hacia adelante y arrojan luz sobre Jesus que es la FUENTE, CUMBRE Y CENTRO de la historia humana! En el día de la Resurrección, cuando Jesus acompañado de los dos discípulos abandonados camino a Emaús, les dijo, “¡Qué torpes son para comprender, y qué duros son para creer lo que dijeron los profetas! ...Y empezando por Moisés y siguiendo por todos los profetas, Jesus les explicó lo que decían de él las escrituras” (Lc. 24:27). En otra aparición Jesus dijo, “Todo lo que han escrito sobre mí en la ley de Moisés, los profetas y los salmos tiene que cumplirse. ...Estaba escrito que el Mesías tenía que morir y resucitar de entre los muertos al tercer día” (Lc, 24:44-46). Por lo tanto la Iglesia utiliza los escritos inspirados en el Antiguo Testamento en su Divina Liturgia para que el Espíritu Santo pueda iluminar nuestras mentes e inflamar nuestros corazones, lo cual nos lleva a una comunicación más profunda con Jesus, en el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida, y a través de Jesus con nuestro Padre celestial y el uno con el otro.
