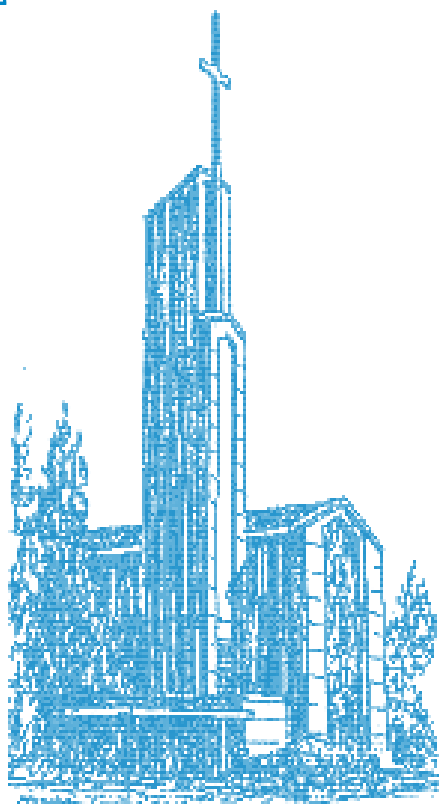

PASTOR'S CORNER

"I came that they may have life and have it to the full" (John 10:10). In view of the tragic 44th anniversary of the infamous Roe vs. Wade decision of January 22, 1973, and the more than 60 million legal abortions that have occurred in the U. S. since that date, here is a reflection and a call to action by Fr. Frank Pavone, founder and director of Priests for Life.

Christmas is universal. "Behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be *for all the people*... A Savior has been born *for you*" (Luke 1:10-11). Christ the Savior becomes man precisely for all who share human nature. He excludes nobody. The good news of Christmas is for all people of all times and places. "Joy to *the world*." ... All of this leads to an inescapable conclusion: *Christmas is also for the unborn.* The Savior has come also for the children yet living in their mothers' wombs. The Gospel message is addressed also to our youngest brothers and sisters. In fact, we can say it is addressed *especially* to them, because they are the most helpless. That good news was announced first precisely to the lowly, not to the great and powerful. The ministry of the One who was born for us continued to follow that pattern: He consistently sought out those who were on the outskirts of society. His Church does the same today, taking a *preferential option for the poor.* The "poor" are not simply those deprived of material goods. "This preferential option for the poor and vulnerable includes all who are marginalized in our nation and beyond—unborn children, persons with disabilities, the elderly and terminally ill, and victims of injustice and oppression" (US Bishops, Faithful Citizenship, 2007). To welcome the Savior means to welcome the obligations which His mission places on us. He is, in the words of the Prophets, one who will establish "justice" on the earth. In Biblical terms, this indicates He will intervene for the helpless, bringing deliverance to those held in bondage. That's all of us, of course, subject to the bondage of sin and death, unable to save ourselves. But it's especially our brothers and sisters in the womb, subject to the additional bondage of a Court decision that said, "The word *person*...does not include the unborn." (Roe vs. Wade, 1973). ... Pope Benedict XVI has taught that "love for widows and orphans, prisoners, and the sick and needy of every kind, is as essential to [the Church] as the ministry of the sacraments and preaching of the Gospel" (*Deus Caritas Est*, no. 22). Our Christmas cannot be complete until we join in the great effort to end the oppression of the unborn once and for all, and let them hear that for them, too, a Savior has been born.

RINCÓN DEL PÁRROCO

“Yo he venido para que tengan vida y la tengan en abundancia.” (Juan 10:10). En vista del trágico 44º aniversario de la infame decisión de Roe vs. Wade del 22 de Enero del 1973, y de los más de 60 millones de abortos legales que han ocurrido en Estados Unidos desde esa fecha, he aquí una reflexión y un llamamiento de acción del Padre Frank Pavone, fundador y director de Sacerdotes por la Vida.

La Navidad es universal. “Os anuncio una gran alegría, que lo será *para todo el pueblo*: os ha nacido un salvador.” (Lucas 2:10-11) Cristo, el Salvador, se hace hombre precisamente para todos los que compartimos la naturaleza humana. No excluye a nadie. La buena noticia de la Navidad es para toda la gente de todos los tiempos en todo lugar. “*Gozo para el mundo.*” Todo esto nos lleva a una conclusión necesaria: la Navidad es también para los no nacidos. El Salvador ha venido también para los niños que viven en el vientre materno. El mensaje del Evangelio se dirige también a nuestros hermanos más jóvenes. De hecho, podemos decir que se dirige *especialmente* a ellos, porque son los más indefensos. La buena noticia fue precisamente anunciada en primer lugar a los de condición más humilde, no a los grandes ni a los poderosos. El ministerio de Aquel que nació por nosotros continuó por ese mismo camino: continuamente buscó a aquellos que estaban en la periferia de la sociedad. Su Iglesia hace hoy lo mismo al hacer una *opción preferencial por los pobres*. Los “pobres” no son solamente los que carecen de bienes materiales. “Esta opción preferencial por los pobres y vulnerables incluye a todos los marginados en nuestra nación y más allá de nuestras fronteras, niños por nacer, personas discapacitadas, los ancianos y los enfermos terminales junto con las víctimas de la opresión y la injusticia. Darle la bienvenida al Salvador significa aceptar las obligaciones que Su misión nos impone. En palabras de los profetas, Él es quien establece la “justicia” en la tierra. En términos bíblicos, eso quiere decir que Él interviene a favor de los indefensos, trayendo la liberación a los encadenados. Por supuesto que eso nos incluye a todos nosotros que estamos sometidos por el poder del pecado y de la muerte y somos incapaces de salvarnos a nosotros mismos. Pero es especialmente para nuestros hermanos en el vientre, que se encuentran sometidos a la opresión de una decisión judicial que dijo que “la palabra *persona*... no incluye a los no nacidos.” (Roe vs. Wade, 1973). El papa Benedicto XVI nos ha enseñado que “practicar el amor hacia las viudas y los huérfanos, los presos, los enfermos y los necesitados de todo tipo, pertenece a su esencia [de la Iglesia] tanto como el servicio de los Sacramentos y el anuncio del Evangelio” (*Deus Caritas Est*, 22). Nuestra Navidad no puede estar completa hasta que nos unamos al gran esfuerzo por acabar de una vez y para siempre con la opresión de los no nacidos y permitir que ellos también se enteren que incluso para ellos ha nacido un Salvador.
