PASTOR'S CORNER

HOW I INTEND TO VOTE. I am my country's good citizen, but God's first. (cf. St. Thomas More). I am proud to be an American because my country professes to be *"one nation, under God, with liberty and justice for all."* My country was grounded on a bedrock principle flowing from the Judeo-Christian ethos of its founders: *"We hold these truths to be self-evident; that all men are created equal, and are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights; among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness"* (Declaration of Independence). Notice that these most basic of human rights, life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, do not come to us from courts, or from legislatures, or from executive directives, or from any human agency. They are endowed on every human being by God, our Creator, at the moment of our creation. I don't need to be a certain age, sex, race, place or economic class to have these rights. I just need to be a human being. THIS OUGHT TO BE SELF EVIDENT! The US government has grievously violated these unalienable rights on a massive scale twice in its history: first with legalized slavery in the Dred-Scott Decision; and second, with legalized abortion in the Roe vs. Wade, Doe vs. Bolton and Casey vs. Planned Parenthood Decisions. These decisions have been made without any reference to God, the Creator. *"They suppress the truth ... they refuse to honor God as God ... and their senseless minds were darkened"* is the way St. Paul described such a state of affairs (Romans 1: 18-22). The consequences of these terrible political decisions are unimaginably harmful to our country: Over 60,000,000 of the most innocent and vulnerable of our brothers and sisters have been slaughtered in the wombs of their mothers in the last 43 years. Mothers, marriages and families have suffered from the pressure to abort, and then from the horrible guilt of having participated in the intrinsic evil of abortion. *"As always, the eclipse of what is divine means the debasement of what is human"* (Cardinal Sarah). I will not, I cannot, vote for any politician or political party that willfully promotes the evil choice of abortion, and even proposes that abortions ought to be paid for with taxpayer money! What about you?

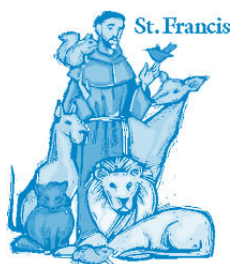

CÓMO TENGO LA INTENCIÓN DE VOTA. Soy un buen ciudadano de mi país, pero primero es Dios. (Cf. Santo Tomás Moro). Estoy orgulloso de ser estadounidense porque mi país profesa ser “una nación, bajo Dios, con libertad y justicia para todos.” Mi país se basa en un principio fundamental que fluye de la ética judeocristiana de sus fundadores: *“Sostenemos que estas verdades son evidentes por sí mismas; que todos los hombres son creados iguales, y son dotados por su Creador de ciertos derechos inalienables; entre estos están la vida, la libertad y la búsqueda a la felicidad.”* (Declaración de la Independencia) Tengan en cuenta que los derechos más básicos: la vida, la libertad y la búsqueda a la felicidad, no nos llegan de los tribunales, o de asambleas legislativas, o de directivas ejecutivas, o de cualquier agencia humana. Están dotados en cada ser humano por Dios, nuestro Creador, en el momento de nuestra creación. No necesito ser de una cierta edad, sexo, lugar o clase económica para tener estos derechos. Sólo tengo que ser un ser humano. ¡ESTO DEBERÍA SER EVIDENTE POR SI MISMO! El gobierno de Estados Unidos ha violado gravemente estos derechos inalienables en una escala masiva en dos ocasiones en su historia: en primer lugar con la esclavitud legalizada en la Decisión Dred-Scott; y en segundo lugar, con la legalización del aborto en el caso Roe vs Wade, Doe vs. Bolton y Casey vs. Decisiones de la Corte Suprema de Planificación de la Familia. Estas decisiones se han realizado sin ninguna referencia a Dios, el Creador. *“Detienen con injusticia la verdad....Porque habiendo conocido a Dios, no le glorificaron como a Dios, ... se envanecieron en sus razonamientos, y su necio corazón fue entenebrecido.”* es la forma en que San Pablo describe tal estado de cosas (Romanos 1:18-22). Las consecuencias de estas terribles decisiones políticas son increíblemente perjudicial para nuestro país: Más de 60 millones de los más inocentes y vulnerables de nuestros hermanos y hermanas han sido sacrificados en el vientre de sus madres en los últimos 43 años. Las madres, los matrimonios y las familias han sufrido la presión de abortar, y luego la terrible culpa de haber participado en el mal intrínseco del aborto. *“Como siempre, el eclipse de lo que es divino significa la degradación de lo humano.”* (Cardenal Sarah). ¡No lo haré, no puedo, votar por cualquier político o partido político que promueve deliberadamente la mal elección del aborto, e incluso propone que los abortos deberían ser pagados con dinero de los contribuyentes! ¿Qué tal tú?
