PASTOR'S CORNER

GET READY TO MAKE THE MOST OF LENT. I've been reading an inspiring book by John R. Wood called, Ordinary Lives. Extraordinary Mission: 5 Steps to Winning the War Within.

Here is a short excerpt to help you have FOCUS for your Lenten Journey right from the beginning.

Albert Einstein once said, "Everybody is a genius, but if you judge a fish by its ability to climb a tree, it will spend its whole life believing it is stupid." A fish does not try to climb trees because it was not created to climb trees. Climbing trees is not essential to a fish's survival.

As human beings, we were created not merely to survive, but to thrive. We can thrive only when we use our unique characteristics in accord with their nature. Trying to serve ourselves is no different than a fish trying to climb a tree. It leaves us just as frustrated because we aren't designed to serve ourselves. We are designed to serve others. ...

Fulfillment in life comes from making a difference in other people's lives. Our current epidemic of depression and despair comes from an unquenched desire to serve others. We have become complacent with simply surviving in this noisy, busy world, and survival most often focuses on self or, at best the people closest to us. Rarely does somebody who's just getting by think of strangers. The danger for most of us comes when we stop believing that we can make a difference in other's lives. ...

Individualism makes us lose sight of our purpose and our mission. It doesn't bring us happiness; it brings us misery. ... Derived from the deadly sin of sloth, minimalism is evident in people always asking themselves, "What is the least I can do?"

We were put here on this earth at this time for a reason – to fulfill a God-given mission. Our destination of sainthood is the same, but our individual journeys are different. We all have genius, something we were created for to assist in the salvation of mankind. It doesn't matter how big or small we perceive our part to be. If we don't each play that part, it won't get played.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

PREPÁRENSE PARA RECIBIR LO MÁXIMO DE LA CUARESMA. He estado leyendo un inspirador libro de John R. Wood titulado, Ordinary Lives, Extraordinary Mission: 5 Steps to Winning the War Within. Aquí hay un breve extracto para ayudarlo a ENFOCARSE en su Viaje de Cuaresma desde el principio.

Albert Einstein dijo una vez: "Todo el mundo es un genio, pero si juzgas a un pez por su habilidad para trepar a un árbol, pasará toda su vida creyendo que es estúpido." Un pez no intenta trepar a los árboles porque no fue creado para escalar árboles. Escalar árboles no es esencial para la supervivencia de un pez. Como seres humanos, fuimos creados no solo para sobrevivir, sino para prosperar. Podemos prosperar solo cuando usamos nuestras características únicas de acuerdo con su naturaleza. Tratar de servirnos a nosotros mismos no es diferente de un pez que intenta trepar a un árbol. Nos deja igual de frustrados porque no estamos diseñados para servirnos a nosotros mismos. Estamos diseñados para servir a otros. ...

El cumplimiento en la vida proviene de hacer una diferencia en la vida de otras personas. Nuestra epidemia actual de depresión y desesperación proviene de un deseo ininterrumpido de servir a los demás. Nos hemos vuelto complacientes con simplemente sobrevivir en este mundo ruidoso y ocupado, y la supervivencia a menudo se centra en sí mismo o, en el mejor de los casos, en las personas más cercanas a nosotros. Rara vez alguien que está de paso piensa en extraños. El peligro para la mayoría de nosotros viene cuando dejamos de creer que podemos hacer una diferencia en las vidas de los demás. ...

El individualismo nos hace perder de vista nuestro propósito y nuestra misión. No nos trae felicidad; nos trae miseria. ... Derivado del pecado mortal de la pereza, el minimalismo es evidente en las personas que siempre se preguntan: "¿Qué es lo menos que puedo hacer?"

Fuimos puestos aquí en esta tierra en este momento por una razón: para cumplir una misión dada por Dios. Nuestro destino de santidad es el mismo, pero nuestros viajes individuales son diferentes. Todos tenemos genio, algo para lo que fuimos creados para ayudar en la salvación de la humanidad. No importa cuán grande o pequeño percibamos nuestra parte. Si no jugamos nuestra parte, no se jugará.
