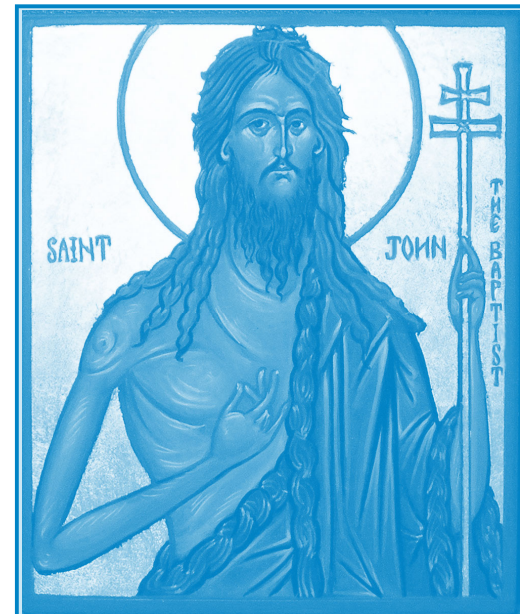

PASTOR'S CORNER

HUMANAE VITAE – ON HUMAN LIFE (Part 3). Some argue that with better safe-sex education in the schools, teaching children how to use the barrier and chemical methods that prevent pregnancy, the need for abortion could become rare. But experience shows that the greater the contraceptive mentality among the sexually active, the greater the number of abortions. Some common methods, such as the IUD device, are marketed as contraceptive, but they actually work as abortifacients. More often than not, promiscuous fathers abdicate all responsibility for conceiving a child, in or out of marriage, and then put pressure on the mother to “get rid of the problem.” In the Supreme Court case, *Planned Parenthood vs. Casey* (1992), the majority opinion that struck down certain State of Pennsylvania restrictions on abortion, argued it this way, “for two decades of economic and social developments, people have organized intimate relationships and made choices that define their views of themselves and their places in society, in reliance on the availability of abortion in the event that contraception should fail.” Saint John Paul II called this phenomenon a “culture of death.” He went on to say, “contraception and abortion are both rotten fruit from the same rotten tree.” The Servant of God, Fr. John Hardon, SJ, put it even clearer: “There is no other way to stop abortion except by stopping contraception.” “The root of the evil of contraception is selfishness.” “Contraception is the single most devastating cause of the breakdown of the family in the modern world and a major cause of the de-Christianization of the world in the last century.” “Contraception says “No” to God and “No” to life.” The contraceptive, abortion-rights, and “pro-choice” mentality is undermining the health of our secular society and is a Satanic attack upon marriage and family, which is the “domestic church.” What can we do to more effectively bring Jesus’ victory over sin and death to bear on this problem? (More next week.)

Your registration affects St. Joachim's & St. Anne's in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, confessions and devotions are planned and scheduled.

RINCÓN DEL PÁRROCO

HUMANAE VITAE - SOBRE LA VIDA HUMANA (Tercera Parte). Algunos argumentan que, con una mejor educación sobre el sexo seguro en las escuelas, enseñándole a los niños cómo usar la barrera y los métodos químicos que previenen el embarazo, la necesidad del aborto podría volverse rara. Pero la experiencia muestra que cuanto mayor es la mentalidad anticonceptiva entre los que están sexualmente activos, mayor es el número de abortos. Algunos métodos comunes, como el dispositivo del DIU, se comercializan como anti-conceptivos, pero en realidad funcionan como abortivos. La mayoría de las veces, los padres promiscuos se abdican de toda responsabilidad por concebir a un hijo, dentro o fuera del matrimonio, y luego presionan a la madre para que “se deshaga del problema”. En el caso de la Corte Suprema, Planned Parenthood vs. Casey (1992), la opinión mayoritaria que anuló ciertas restricciones del estado de Pensilvania al aborto, lo argumentó de esta manera, “*durante dos décadas de desarrollo económico y social, las personas han organizado relaciones íntimas y tomado decisiones que definen sus puntos de vista sobre sí mismos y sus lugares en la sociedad, confiando en la disponibilidad del aborto en caso de que la anticoncepción falle.*” San Juan Pablo II llamó a este fenómeno una “cultura de la muerte”. Continuó diciendo, “*la anticoncepción y el aborto son frutos podridos del mismo árbol podrido*” El Siervo de Dios, el Padre. John Hardon, SJ, lo puso aún más claro: “*No hay otra manera de detener el aborto, excepto al detener la anticoncepción.*” “*La raíz del mal de la anticoncepción es el egoísmo.*” “*La anticoncepción es la causa más devastadora del colapso de la familia en el mundo moderno y una de las principales causas de la descristianización del mundo en el siglo pasado.*” “*La anticoncepción dice ‘No’ a Dios y ‘No’ a la vida.*” El anticonceptivo, los derechos del aborto, y la mentalidad de elección (pro-choice) están minando la salud de nuestra sociedad secular y es un ataque satánico contra el matrimonio y la familia, que es la “iglesia doméstica”. ¿Qué podemos hacer para llevar más efectivamente la victoria de Jesús sobre el pecado y la muerte a este problema? (Más la próxima semana).
