Shepherds Field Olive Wood Handcrafts

A group from the Holy Land (Bethlehem & Jerusalem) will be selling religious articles after masses to support the Catholic Christian minorities in Bethlehem. As a tradition, many of the Catholic families in the Holy Land work in small workshops to produce religious articles from olive wood. These articles represent the Christian art of the Holy Land. In the past, they used to sell their artwork to pilgrims who visit the Holy Land. However, these days they are facing an economic hardship as very few tourists visit the Holy Land due to security issues. Many of the Catholic families immigrated and left the Holy Land. The percentage of Christians in the Holy Land has dropped to less than 2%. Therefore, if this hardship continues as it is now, we believe that in a few years, there will be no Catholics in Bethlehem or Jerusalem. The struggle to preserve the Catholic identity of the birthplace of our savior; Jesus Christ is a serious concern for Catholics around the world. Sales will be used to help and support the Catholics in the Holy Land and to encourage them not to immigrate.

PASTOR'S CORNER

“WELCOMING THE REFUGEE AND THE MIGRANT: Fear of the stranger and a desire to protect one's own family or community from the unknown are ingrained in human behavior. Yet these are just a few of the responses that human beings are capable of. From ancient times till today there is also the impulse to extend hospitality and protection to those who are displaced, homeless or in great need. The Catholic Church is consistent and forthright in support of migrants and refugees, calling all the faithful to welcome and protect them. This support is not the result of a political agenda, and the Church affirms the right of any country to protect its borders. Yet the deepest traditions and teachings of Judaism and Christianity encourage us to overcome our fears and aid the poor, the homeless and the stranger.

The word, “parish” reflects our own self-image as a pilgrim people. It comes from the Greek word, “paroikos,” which means a body of migrants or sojourners living in a specific territory.

It is imperative that we allow God's Word and Spirit to transform our minds and our hearts. “When an alien resides with you in your land, do not mistreat such a one. You shall treat the alien who resides with you no differently than the natives born among you; you shall love the alien as yourself; for you too were once aliens in the land of Egypt” (Exodus 19:34). America is a nation of immigrants. Even the ancestors of so-called “native Americans” were immigrants at some point in history. More basic still, America is a nation of human beings, equal in dignity, “endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights; among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness” (Declaration of Independence, Sacred Tradition, Sacred Scripture and Magisterial Teaching). Let us express this Truth and Good News in our political efforts to bring about comprehensive reform to our nation's immigration policies. May these policies meet the standard of liberty and justice for all.

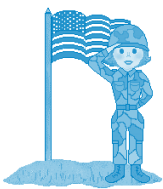

RINCÓN DEL PÁRROCO

“BIENVENIDOS AL REFUGIADO Y A EL MIGRANTE: El temor al extranjero y el deseo de proteger a nuestra familia ó a nuestra comunidad de lo desconocido estan arraigados en el comportamiento humano. Sin embargo, estas son sólo algunas de las respuestas de las cuales los seres humanos son capaces de hacer. Desde la antigüedad hasta el día de hoy todavía hay el impulso de extender hospitalidad y protección a aquellos que son desplazados, que no tienen un hogar o que tienen mucha necesidad. La Iglesia Católica es consecuente y directa en apoyo a los migrantes y refugiados, pidiendo a todos los fieles a recibirlos y protegerlos. Este apoyo no es el resultado de una agenda política, y la iglesia afirma el derecho de todos los países de proteger sus fronteras. Sin embargo las tradiciones más profundas y las enseñanzas del Judaísmo y del cristianismo nos animan a vencer nuestros temores y a ayudar a los pobres, a las personas sin hogar y a el extranjero. La palabra, “parroquia” refleja nuestra propia imagen como un pueblo peregrino. Proviene de la palabra griega, “paroikos”, que significa cuerpo de migrantes o residents que viven en un territorio específico. Es imperativo que permitamos que la Palabra y el Espíritu de Dios transformen nuestras mentes y nuestros corazones. “Cuando un extranjero reside contigo en tu tierra, no lo maltrates. Debes tratar al extranjero que reside contigo de la misma manera que a los nativos-nacidos entre si; amarás al extranjero como a ti mismo; porque ustedes también fueron extranjeros la tierra de Egipto” (Éxodo 19:34).
