**PASTOR'S CORNER**

**How to Celebrate Halloween.** When I was in grade school in the late 1950s, dressing up in a costume and going “trick or treating” to gain a bag full of candy was something I looked forward to each year. When I reached Jr. High, I began to feel too old for the tradition of trick or treating. In high school, trick or treating gave way to costume parties with games like bobbing for apples, etc. Times have changed. Today, costumes of monsters, ghouls, devils, skeletons, ghosts, witches, blood and gore, abound. Much of Halloween in today’s culture has taken a turn toward the sinister. As followers of Christ we need to be wary of just going along with the trends in the culture. We need to avoid customs which focus on fear, superstition, horror movies and occult practices. In our Christian tradition, there is so much of the Good, the True and the Beautiful that is worthy of celebration. “Halloween” literally means, “the Eve of All Saints Day.” All Saints Day has been celebrated in the Church on November 1st since the year of our Lord 835. A costume celebrating a Saint is better than one that focuses on the fear of death, a demon or a ghost. November 2<sup>nd</sup> is All Souls Day, a day to celebrate Jesus’ victory over sin, death, and the devil. We remember our loved ones who have died because of our certain belief that for those who die in grace life is changed for the better and not ended. There may be a need for final purification, called purgatory. God, in His Mercy, invites us to join our prayers and love to the perfect love of His Son, to bring this final purification about. Why not include the praying of a Rosary in our celebrations of Halloween, All Saints Day and All Souls Day. Our Lady of Fatima teaches us to pray, “*O my Jesus, forgive us our sins; save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls into Heaven, especially those who are most in need of Thy mercy. Amen.*”

**Cómo Celebrar Halloween.** Cuando estaba en la escuela primaria a finales de la década de 1950, vestirse con un disfraz y hacer un “trick or treat” para ganar una bolsa llena de dulces era algo que esperaba cada año. Cuando llegué a la secundaria, comencé a sentirme demasiado viejo para la tradición de trick or treat. En la Preparatoria, el trick or treat dió paso a las fiestas de disfraces con juegos como el bamboleo de las manzanas, etc. Los tiempos han cambiado. Hoy en día, abundan los disfraces de monstruos, espíritus necrófagos, demonios, esqueletos, fantasmas, brujas, sangre. Gran parte de Halloween en la cultura de hoy ha tomado un giro hacia lo siniestro. Como seguidores de Cristo, debemos ser cautelosos de seguir las tendencias de la cultura. Debemos evitar las costumbres que se centran en el miedo, la superstición, las películas de terror y las prácticas ocultas. En nuestra tradición Cristiana, hay tanto de lo Bueno, Verdadero y Hermoso que es digno de celebración. “Halloween” significa literalmente “el día de la víspera de todos los Santos.” El Día de todos los Santos se ha celebrado en la iglesia el 1° de Noviembre desde el año de nuestro Señor 835. Un traje que celebra a un Santo es mejor que uno que se enfoca en el miedo a la muerte, un demonio o un fantasma. El 2 de Noviembre es el Día de los Fieles Difuntos, un día para celebrar la victoria de Jesús sobre el pecado, la muerte y el demonio. Recordamos a nuestros seres queridos que han muerto debido a cierta creencia de que para aquellos que mueren en gracia, la vida cambia para lo mejor y no se termina. Puede haber una necesidad de purificación final, llamada purgatorio. Dios, en Su misericordia, nos invita a unir nuestras oraciones y amar al amor perfecto de su Hijo, para llevar a cabo esta purificación final. Por qué no incluir la oración de un Rosario en nuestras celebraciones de Halloween, el Día de Todos los Santos y el Día de los Fieles Difuntos. Nuestra Señora de Fátima nos enseña a orar, *“Oh Jesús mío, perdona nuestros pecados; libranos del fuego del infierno; concede a todas las almas al cielo, especialmente a las más necesitadas de tu divina misericordia. Amén.”*
